El Dorado Transit recorded 7,175 taps or 24.8% of all ridership in February 2018. 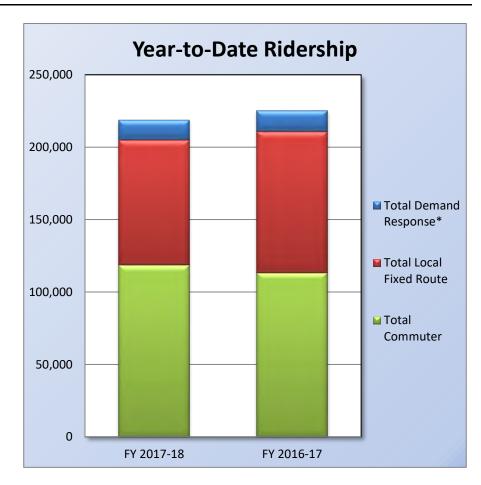

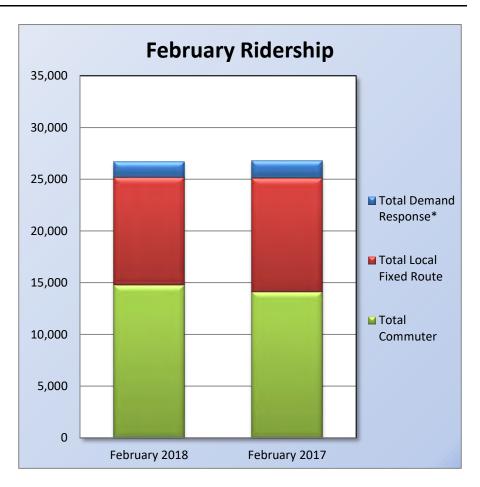

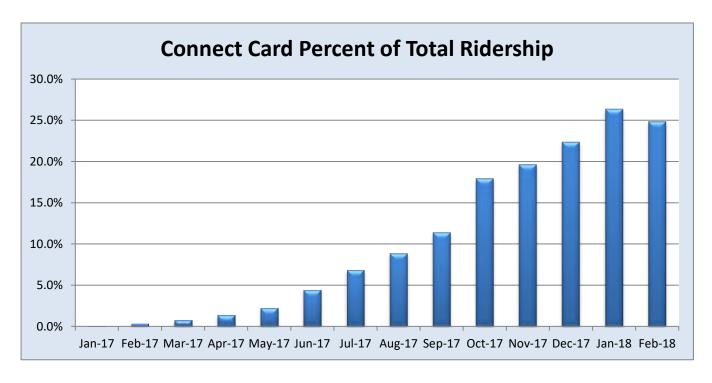

BACKGROUND

In July 2004, the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) issued GASB Statement No. 45, *Accounting and Financial Reporting by Employers for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pension*. GASB 45 mandates disclosure of Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) liabilities for public employees. OPEB may include benefits such as medical, dental, prescription drug, vision and life insurance plans. GASB 45 establishes a standard for measuring and reporting the liability of retirement benefits other than pensions however; it does not require funding the liability.

During Fiscal Year (FY) 2007/08 El Dorado Transit contracted with California Public Employers' Retirement System (CalPERS) to provide cost effective medical insurance for the unrepresented employee group (23 employees). CalPERS contractually requires El Dorado Transit to contribute an amount towards the cost of retiree medical coverage as a condition of participating in the CalPERS medical plans. There are two (2) eligible retirees who have elected coverage. Monthly cost to the agency is currently at the lowest level possible of \$73.15 per eligible retiree. This contribution is based on a formula and increases a modest amount each year.

On August 5, 2010 the Board adopted resolution 10-10 to pre-fund the OPEB future liability by placing assets in the CERBT program to allow for a manageable dollar amount to be budgeted each year for contributions to build reserves and earn interest to

offset the cost of the program. A thirty (30) year amortization period is consistent with the anticipated retirement trend of current employees.

• March 1, 2018 Board Accepted the current Valuation of OPEB for fiscal years 2017/18 and 2018/19 and adopted Resolution No. 18-10 approving the prefund amounts.

DISCUSSION

The El Dorado Transit continuing retiree health plan allows eligible retirees to enroll in the agency group medical plan through CalPERS at time of separation or at any subsequent open enrollment period. The plan includes only medical insurance coverage excluding other possible retiree benefits e.g. dental, vision, etc. Since plan inception in 2007, two (2) eligible participants have elected coverage however; three (3) eligible retirees may enroll during any open enrollment period. There are twenty-seven (27) current employees who are qualified, and nine (9) who may retire within the next five (5) years. These employees have the option to continue their medical coverage under this plan.

Actuarial valuations are used as a method of verifying the changing conditions of an agency's employee statistics that impact the annual cost of OPEB and outstanding obligations or future potential liabilities. CalPERS requires an actuarial valuation every two (2) years under the CERBT pooling program.

El Dorado Transit contracted Bickmore to complete an actuarial valuation of other postemployment benefits to capture and report the current and future potential liabilities of this benefit. This report provides statistics as of July 1, 2017 for the years ending June 30, 2018 and June 30, 2019.

Staff is requesting the approval to prefund OPEB in the amount of \$55,631 for FY 2017/18 as calculated in the March 1, 2018 Board Accepted Valuation of OPEB for fiscal years 2017/18 and 2018/19.

FISCAL IMPACT

Fiscal Year 2017/18 Mid-Year Budget adopted on March 1, 2018 includes this amount.

BACKGROUND

The Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP) is a component of the Transit, Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities Program established by the California Legislature in 2014 under Senate Bill 862. The purpose of this program is to provide operating and capital assistance to transit agencies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and improve mobility, with a focus on environmentally disadvantaged communities. Funding is available to current Public Utilities Commission (PUC) 99313, and 99314 fund recipients.

DISCUSSION

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) is applying for \$217,678 in LCTOP funds to continue to partially fund the service enhancements that were implemented in Cameron Park effective July 6, 2015. As per the Administrative Operations Report, the total expenses for the Cameron Park route in Fiscal Year (FY) 2016/17 were \$414,935.

The project is based on the recommendations of the adopted <u>2014 Western El Dorado County Short- and Long- Range Transit Plan</u>, June 2014. The project increases the service levels in Cameron Park from 180 minute headways (service every three (3) hours), to 60 minute headways (service every hour) localized to Cameron Park.

This funding request complements currently programmed and approved Local Transportation Funds (LTF) as indicated in the Board approved budget.

FISCAL IMPACT

The Fiscal Year 2017/18 Caltrans Division of Rail and Mass Transportation Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP) grant application represents a total of \$217,678 in potential revenue for FY 2018/19 transit operations in Cameron Park.

BACKGROUND

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) adopted a *Vehicle Replacement Policy* on February 6, 1997 based on Caltrans and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) guidelines. El Dorado Transit is required to utilize FTA guidelines for replacement vehicles purchased through FTA capital assistance grant programs. A copy of the Vehicle Replacement Policy is included for reference.

DISCUSSION

El Dorado Transit staff adheres to the adopted *Vehicle Replacement Policy*, February 1997 to develop replacement plans. This policy is critical for budget forecasting, vehicle inventory management and developing capital assistance grants.

The Replacement Plan for fiscal years 2018/19 through 2024/25 represents a plan for vehicle replacement of current fleet vehicles contingent upon capital revenues available and grant opportunities.

El Dorado Transit has received grants for the vehicles marked in bold, and purchase orders are being prepared. Cut-a-Way bus number 1606 was a total loss in a recent accident and is being replaced using funds from the insurance claim. Staff has submitted a grant application to replace six (6) Local Fixed Route buses.

FISCAL IMPACT

Individual replacement projects are brought before the Board as developed.

EL DORADO COUNTY TRANSIT AUTHORITY

VEHICLE REPLACEMENT POLICY

This policy provides that transit vehicles are maintained and remain in mass transit use for their normal service lives. Compliance with this policy will be assurance that El Dorado County Transit Authority meets the Federal guidelines and is eligible for projects programmed for capital assistance offered by the Federal Transportation Administration.

Service life of rolling stock begins on the date the vehicle is placed in revenue service and continues until it is removed from service.

Bus Requirements

- (a) <u>Minimum Normal Service Life.</u> Minimum normal service lives for buses are stated below:
 - 1. <u>Standard size heavy duty (approximately 35' 40') transit buses:</u> at least twelve (12) years service or an accumulation of at least 500,000 miles.
 - 2. <u>Medium size heavy duty (approximately 30') transit buses:</u> at least ten (10) years of service or an accumulation of at least 350,000 miles.
 - 3. <u>Small medium duty (under 30') transit buses:</u> at least seven (7) years or an accumulation of at least 200,000 miles.
 - 4. Other vehicles such as regular and specialized vans: at least four years service or an accumulation of at least 100,000 miles.

(b) Previously Owned, Rehabilitated Buses and Specialty Vehicles:

Fleet vehicles purchased as "previously owned", rehabilitated and Specialty vehicles shall have the maintenance records reviewed and the vehicle inspected bi-annually to determine safety and maintenance costs. The El Dorado County Transit Authority Director or his/her designated staff shall determine the replacement schedule on these vehicles.

BACKGROUND

With the economic downturn of 2008, management of the El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) developed a policy to set up an operating reserve fund.

On August 4, 2011 the El Dorado Transit Board adopted Resolution No. 11-26 and 11-27 and Board Policy B-2 for development of a Board-Designated Operating Reserve Fund. Section 2.00 Establishing a Reserve states; "Any Board-Directed Operating Reserve Fund shall be established by resolution with a majority vote of the Board"

This operating reserve fund is a stand-alone interest bearing account funded annually using non-tax revenue accounts such as Bike Locker Rental and Advertising revenues.

Acknowledging this fund would be a long-term project to fully fund, staff worked with the El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) to establish a second Contingency account held by EDCTC as recommended in the EDCTC April 2013 Triennial Performance Audit.

The Contingency account held by EDCTC will be fully funded at \$500,000, as of Fiscal Year (FY) 2018/19. This was achieved by funding the EDCTC account with an annual allocation of 3% of Local Transportation Funds of the annual allocation for El Dorado Transit.

The balance of the operating reserve account held by El Dorado Transit is \$98,819.34 at January 31, 2018 after five (5) years of funding; the target funding level per resolution 11-26 is \$1,500,000.

DISCUSSION

A review of Board Policy B-2 has been completed to apprise the Board of the current status of El Dorado Transit's reserve fund and the EDCTC held contingency fund as outlined above.

Each year during the budget process management recommends funding the Operating Reserve Fund using non-tax income. Over the past five (5) years the average funding amount is \$19,500. It would take over seventy-five (75) years to fund this account to the \$1,500,000 target level.

With the addition of the contingency account in 2014 held by EDCTC, management endorses the "blending" of the two (2) accounts for a balance of approximately \$598,819.34 of Reserve/Contingency funds available for use by El Dorado Transit.

Per EDCTC Board Policy the maximum contingency fund balance is \$500,000. El Dorado Transit management feels this benchmark is adequate with future 3% allocations to this account on an as used/needed basis.

Staff is recommending the adoption of Resolution No. 18-16 to adjust the target level of funding to a more realistic goal of \$1,000,000.

With the current average of \$19,500 per year, the target funding amount would be reached in approximately 20 years.

Staff is researching statutes to determine if El Dorado Transit can use different methods for funding the Reserve.

WHEREAS, the Board has designated non-tax based revenues to be used to fund such an Operating Reserve; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide adequate and appropriate funding to an Operating Reserve Fund, Board wishes to set an optimal minimum operating reserve level.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the El Dorado County Transit Authority as follows:

- 1. The Board hereby sets an optimum minimum operating reserve level for an Operating Reserve Fund at \$1,000,000.
- 2. The projected amount of funding for the Operating Reserve Fund shall be determined annually during each budget process by El Dorado Transit management staff, based on actual expenditures, planned service reductions or expansions and adjustments for extraordinary expenditures.
- 3. The Operating Reserve Fund for each fiscal year shall be funded prior to the year-end closing of the preceding year, subject to Board approval.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, This Resolution supersedes Resolution No. 11-27.

BACKGROUND

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) utilizes fare boxes to collect cash and scrip from passengers. The current fare boxes that were manufactured by Main Fare Box have been used for more than twenty (20) years. The company is no longer manufacturing fare boxes and no longer supports the boxes that are currently used by El Dorado Transit.

On February 1, 2018 the Board of Directors approved Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Project 18-07 for new fare boxes.

DISCUSSION

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) purchasing procedures allow an exemption to competitive bidding per the following approved El Dorado Transit Purchasing Procedures:

"3.12.132 Exemptions from competitive bidding.

- A. Notwithstanding the provision of Section 3.12.130 herein, competitive bidding need not be required when the Purchasing Agent determines: 1) competitive bidding would not be in the public interest because of emergency, or: 2) the unique nature of the property or service required precludes competitive bidding, or: 3) competitive bidding would produce no economic benefit to the agency.
- B. The exemption provided by subsection (A) herein shall apply only to the purchase of such items listed below or that have been identified by resolution of the El Dorado Transit Board of Directors."

The Executive Director verifies that El Dorado Transit Staff follow all procurement policies. El Dorado Transit Staff researched available fare boxes and determined that Diamond Manufacturing, Inc. was the only fare box manufacturer that makes fare boxes with removable locking vaults. Therefore, Diamond Manufacturing, Inc. is the sole source of the fare boxes.

FISCAL IMPACT

The Purchase Order amount is within the approved CIP #18-07 adopted on February 1, 2018 for new fare boxes in Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-18 budget.

REQUESTED ACTION:

- 1. Adopt Resolution No. 18-12 revising the Adopted El Dorado County Transit Authority Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual
- 2. Adopt and Approve Revised Office Assistant II Job Classification

BACKGROUND

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) currently provides the Office Assistant II Job Classification with the option of Bilingual Pay Differential.

ARTICLE 4.10: Bilingual Differential:

An employee that utilizes bilingual skills as a required component of the employee's job duties and is necessary in the delivery of El Dorado Transit services shall be paid a bilingual differential.

El Dorado Transit has not had an employee paid under this policy since February 2013 and has since utilized Language Line Solutions to assist interpreting with Spanish speaking clients.

After review of the amount of time spent on bilingual calls during the course of six (6) months from September 2017 through February 2018, staff has determined the Bilingual Pay Differential (BPD) is not necessary for operational purposes.

DISCUSSION

Staff examined calls received during the last six (6) months that required assistance from the Language Line Solutions. The findings are as follows:

- Eleven calls received that required translator services from September 2017 February 2018. That is an average of 1.83 calls per month
- Total of 19,000 calls received from September 2017 February 2018. That is an average of .05% of the total calls that required a Spanish translator

Over the last six (6) months from September 2017 through February 2018, the average numbers of calls that required interpreting services for Spanish speaking customers was .05% of the total call volume. The cost to maintain the service for the last six (6) was on average \$11.60 per month. Total annual cost is approximately \$140.00.

The current BPD Policy and Salary Schedule provides an additional \$1.00 per hour for an Office Assistant II who speaks fluent Spanish. A full-time employee within this position works on average 2080 hours per year at a starting salary of \$15.36 (step 1) an hour, plus an additional \$1.00 an hour for the BPD. The incumbent would earn an additional \$2,080.00 annually or \$173.33 a month and they would only utilize their skill approximately .10% of their time.

Additionally, El Dorado Transit would have to maintain the Language Line Service, to cover absences and additional languages.

El Dorado Transit staff has concluded that it is no longer necessary for the current job classification of Office Assistant II to include the pay option of Bilingual Differential due to the insignificant amount of time spent utilizing this skill and the minimal cost to maintain Language Line Solutions. Staff recommends *ARTICLE 4.10 Bilingual Differential* be removed from the current Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual and from the Office Assistant II job classification. A revised salary schedule is included on Agenda Item 1L and will be updated accordingly upon approval and adoption of the recommendation.

With removal of this pay differential option, there is no monetary impact at this time considering we do not have any employees who are currently classified to receive this pay.

4.10 Bilingual Differential

An employee that utilizes bilingual skills as a required component of the employee's job duties and is necessary in the delivery of El Dorado Transit services shall be paid a bilingual differential.

ARTICLE 5 - PAID AND UNPAID LEAVE POLICIES

Employees are expected to be at work at scheduled times. To ensure accountability and the integrity of public service, all employees are expected to account for their absences from work. Leave time is chargeable in increments of one-tenth (1/10) of an hour.

In cases where an employee knows in advance of the need to take a leave, the employee shall complete a Leave Request Form in advance of the requested time off and receive approval for use of the leave time prior to its use.

Leave shall be subject to approval by the employee's supervisor, and scheduled in advance whenever possible, with due regard for the service needs of El Dorado Transit and the employee's workload.

El Dorado Transit may employ any reasonable measure to ensure employees have properly accounted for leaves, including requiring reasonable proof that the basis for the leave is legitimate. Abuse of leave privileges, including but not limited to working for a secondary employer while on sick leave or using sick leave while an employee is on vacation, may subject an employee to disciplinary action, up to and including termination.

5.1 Vacations

For purposes of this section, one year shall be equivalent to twenty-six (26) bi-weekly pay periods of continuous service.

Accrual Rates and Maximum Accumulation

Every full-time and part-time employee shall accrue and accumulate vacation leave with pay as follows:

Each full-time and part-time employee with less than four years continuous service shall accrue vacation credit at the rate of .03875 an hour for each full hour in pay status (equal to 3.1 hours for full-time in a full pay period). In no case shall an employee with less than four years continuous service accumulate more than 240 hours vacation leave.

Each full-time and part-time employee with four years or more continuous service shall accrue vacation credit at the rate of .05875 hour for each full hour in pay status (equal to

Adopt Resolution No. 18-18, a Resolution to Accept an Irrevocable Offer of Dedication #18-01, from Salud, et. al., which conveys fee title and a slope easement to a portion of the Bass Lake Hills Park and Ride site.

BACKGROUND

The Bass Lake Hills Specific Plan (BLHSP) requires the Developers of subdivisions within the plan area to provide the land necessary to construct a 200 space Park and Ride facility just north of US Hwy. 50 at Bass Lake Road and Tiera De Dios Drive. The BLHSP also requires the Developers to construct the Park and Ride in phases, as the individual subdivisions within the Specific Plan are built.

The pace of development within the BLHSP has varied over the past 20 years, depending on ownership of the subject lands and the viability of development in relation to the economy. Most recently, modifications to the Public Facilities Financing Plan (PFFP) were approved by the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors, and on February 28, 2017 the Board of Supervisors approved the Rezoning, Planned Development and Tentative Subdivision Map for the Bass Lake North Project. Also at that time, the September 2016 Addendum to the 1992 Bass Lake Road Study Area Final Program Environmental Impact Report (EIR) was approved, which requires the Developer to acquire the necessary land and construct the first 100 spaces of the Park and Ride.

In order to satisfy the requirement for acquisition and construction of the Bass Lake Hills Park and Ride, the Developers have negotiated settlements with two affected property owners, Salud et. al. (APN 119-100-17) and Carolyn M. Uchikura (APN 119-100-57). 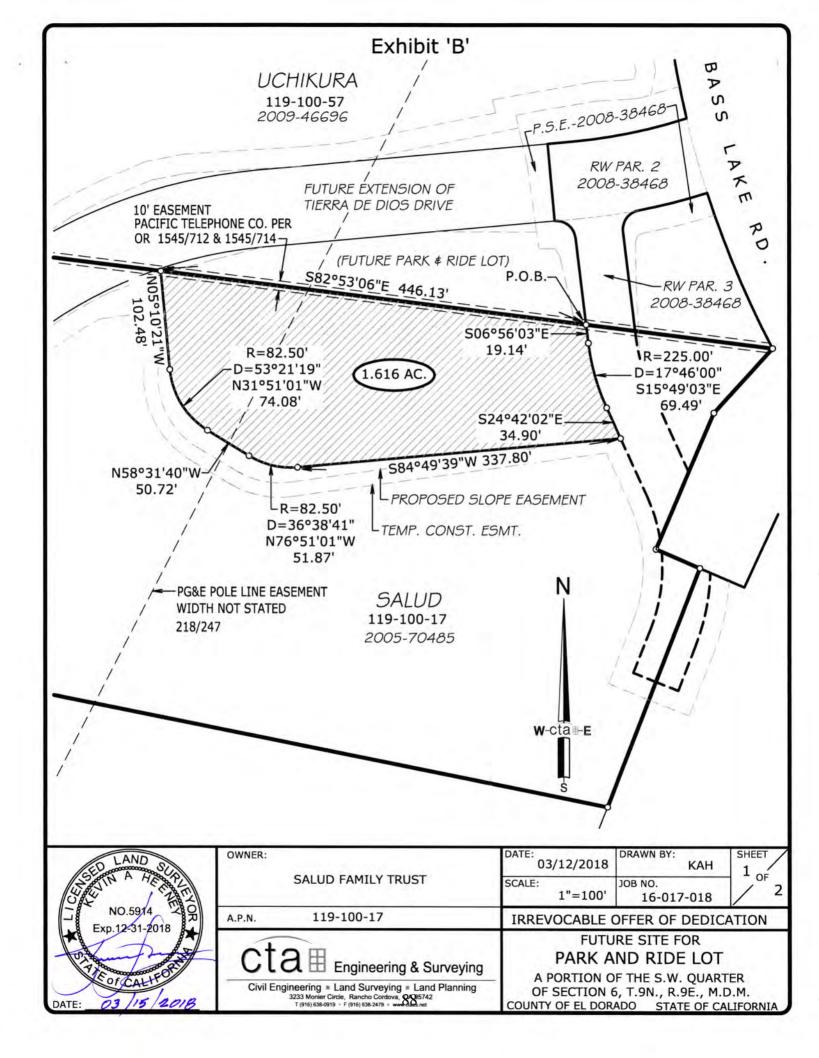

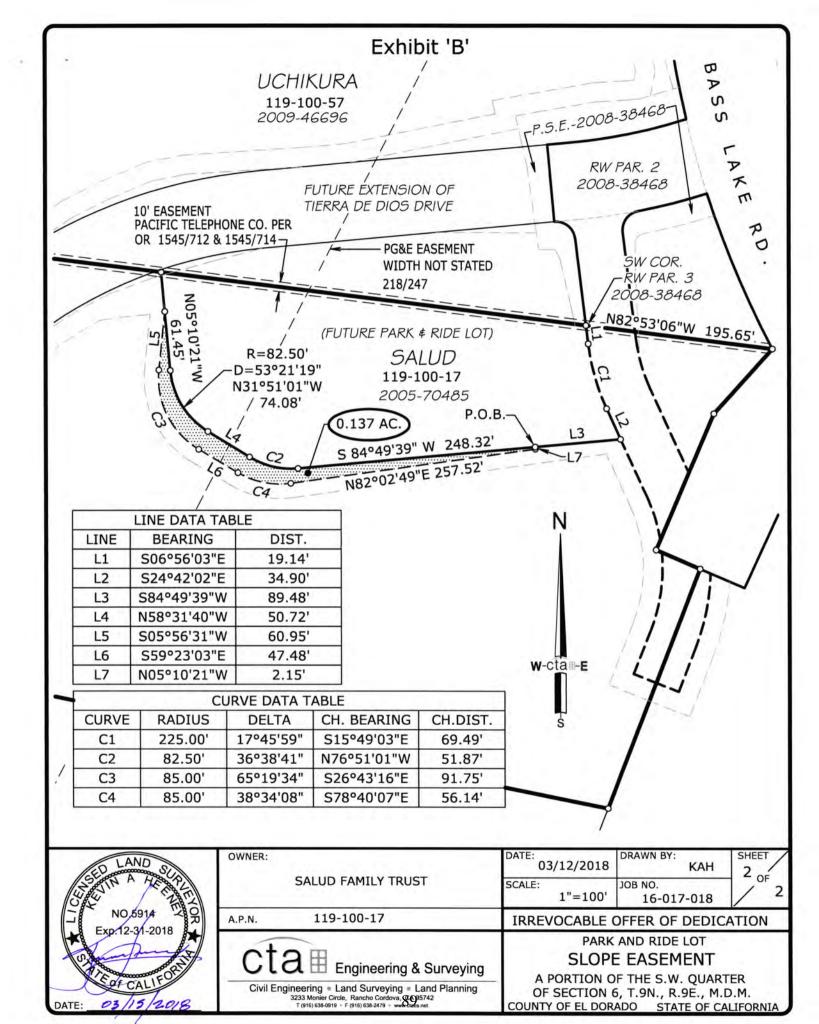

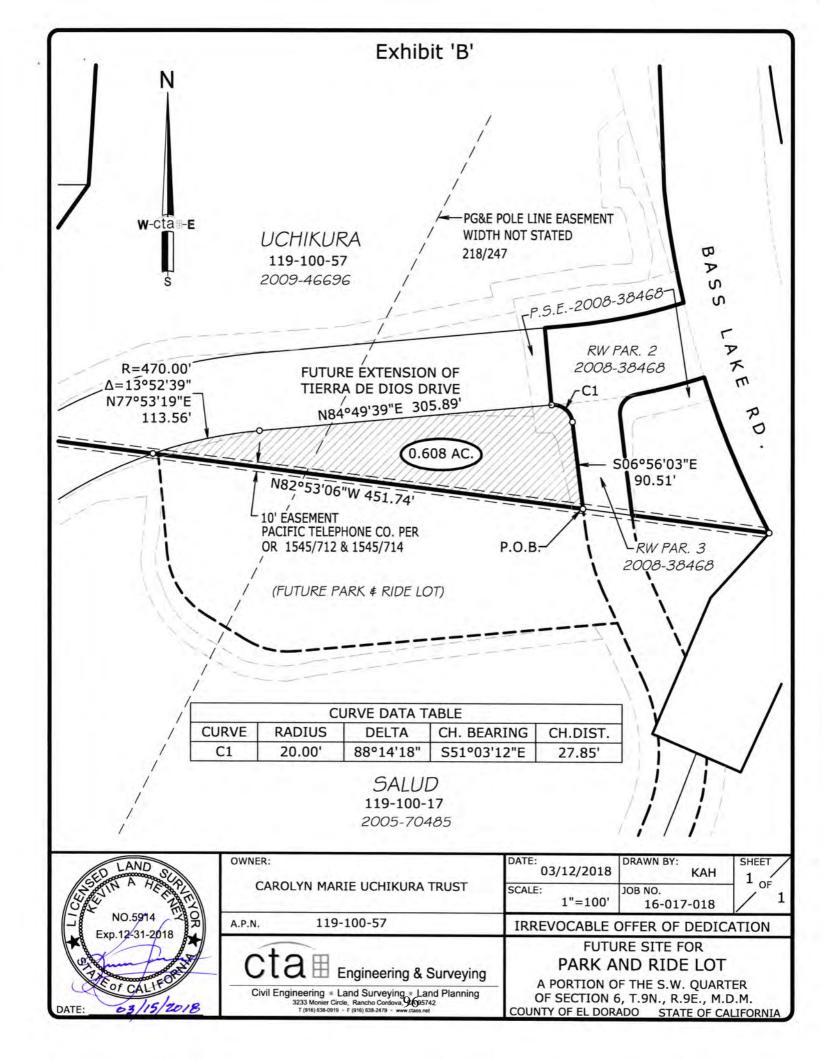

- 1. Approve Professional Services Agreement (PSA) with RTS Computer Services for Computer and Network Support Services for Fiscal Year 2018/19
- 2. Approve Purchase Order No. B24023 for an amount not-to-exceed \$70,000.00 for Informational Technology Support during Fiscal Year 2018/19

BACKGROUND

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) implemented several strategies to maintain the appropriate level of informational technology support over a ten (10) year period including hiring an information technology support staff person; contracting with small companies; opportunities for and sharing staff with public agencies. It was determined that a larger private computer services support business with a depth of staff and expertise would provide technical support necessary for an agency the size of El Dorado Transit.

Beginning in September 2013, RTS Computer Services (RTS) has provided informational technology support as noted in the attached RTS ITCare Agreement Fiscal Year (FY) 2018/19:

- Ongoing computer support for El Dorado Transit staff as required
- Troubleshoot, maintain, and manage the network, services. computers and peripherals
- Maintain software updates and upgrades for all operating systems
- Hardware and software purchasing assistance
- Hardware and software installation assistance
- Provide prompt service response time

DISCUSSION

The attached Professional Services Agreement (Agreement) is a standard agreement approved as to form by legal counsel. Exhibit A and Exhibit B to the Agreement details the scope of work and fee schedule.

Exhibit A of the Professional Services Agreement is the proposed RTS ITCare Agreement FY 2018/19. The proposed rate of \$95.00 per month per device (workstations and servers) will remain static.

Exhibit B of the Professional Services Agreement is an addendum to the proposed RTS ITCare Agreement FY 2018/19 for continued management of local backup repositories for all designated Managed Servers. The proposed rate of \$175.00 per month will remain static.

Approved as to form by El Dorado Transit Legal Counsel.

FISCAL IMPACT

Fiscal Year 2018/19 Preliminary Budget includes \$70,000.00 in the Service Contracts and Equipment budget line Item 5090.06 for computer and network support.

SECTION 2 - SCOPE OF CONSULTING SERVICES - BASIC; SCHEDULE

CONSULTANT agrees to perform all work described in Exhibit "A" entitled <u>ITCare</u> <u>Agreement FY 2018-19</u> and Exhibit "B" entitled <u>ITCare Agreement FY 2018-19 Addendum 1</u> attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference as if set forth in full.

SECTION 3 - SCOPE OF CONSULTING SERVICES - ADDITIONAL

It is understood by EL DORADO TRANSIT and CONSULTANT that it may be necessary, in connection with this project, for CONSULTANT to perform or secure the performance of related services other than those set forth in Exhibit "A". In such instance, CONSULTANT shall advise EL DORADO TRANSIT, in advance and in writing, of the need for such additional services, their cost and the estimated time required to perform them (if appropriate). CONSULTANT shall not proceed to perform any such additional service until EL DORADO TRANSIT has determined that such service is beyond the scope of the basic services to be provided by CONSULTANT, is required, and has given its written authorization to perform or obtain it. Each additional service so authorized shall constitute an amendment to this Agreement.

<u>SECTION 4 – PURCHASE ORDER AND EFFECTIVE DATE OF CONTRACT; PROGRESS;</u> COMPLETION

Upon execution of this Agreement by the parties, EL DORADO TRANSIT shall give CONSULTANT a 'Purchase Order' for the work. Such notice may authorize CONSULTANT to render all of the services contemplated herein, or such portions or phases as may be mutually agreed upon. In the latter event, EL DORADO TRANSIT shall, in its sole discretion, issue subsequent notices from time to time regarding further portions or phases of the work. Upon receipt of such notices, CONSULTANT shall diligently proceed with the work authorized and complete it within the agreed time period.

SECTION 5 - TIME OF PERFORMANCE

CONSULTANT shall commence work within five (5) days following issuance of a Purchase Order. CONSULTANT shall complete the performance of its obligations under this Agreement in accordance with the dates and times indicated in Exhibit "A", unless an extension of

time is granted in writing by EL DORADO TRANSIT, which said extension, if any, shall be granted only for good cause as determined at the sole discretion of EL DORADO TRANSIT. CONSULTANT shall not be held responsible for delays beyond its reasonable control.

SECTION 6 - COMPENSATION

For services performed pursuant to this Agreement as outlined in Exhibits A and B, EL DORADO TRANSIT agrees to pay and CONSULTANT agrees to accept as payment in full, the amount of \$4,592.50 per month plus payments for additional approved services not to exceed a total amount of \$70,000.00 for informational technology support.

CONSULTANT shall submit a bill each month upon successful completion of the monthly services outlined in said Exhibits A and Exhibit B attached hereto. Payment shall be made by EL DORADO TRANSIT within fifteen (15) days of receipt of the billing for the completed task. No statements shall be sent until the task has been accepted as complete by EL DORADO TRANSIT. It is mutually agreed between the parties that no payments made under the Agreement shall be conclusive evidence of the performance of the Agreement, either wholly or in part, against any claim of the CONSULTANT, and no payment shall be construed to be in acceptance of any defective work or improper materials.

SECTION 7 – ADDITIONAL WORK

In the event non-covered services on an hourly basis as set forth in Exhibit A are required, CONSULTANT shall submit a work order to TRANSIT listing the scope and cost of such services. CONSULTANT may proceed to complete such additional work upon receipt of written approval by TRANSIT. The costs for such additional work shall be submitted with the monthly bill and shall include a detailed explanation of the work performed, the individual completing the work, the date the work was performed and the hours spent in completing the work.

SECTION 8 - COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS, RULES, REGULATIONS

All services performed by CONSULTANT pursuant to this Agreement shall be performed in accordance and full compliance with professional standards regarding the interpretation of all applicable and non-conflicting Federal, State or City statutes as amended, and any rules or regulations promulgated thereunder, as interpreted by the appropriate enforcement agency at the time of performance of this project.

SECTION 9 - EXHIBITS INCORPORATED

All Exhibits referred to in this Agreement and attached to it are hereby incorporated in it by this reference.

SECTION 10 - RESPONSIBILITY OF CONSULTANT

By executing this Agreement, CONSULTANT warrants to EL DORADO TRANSIT that he/she possesses, or will arrange to secure from others, all of the necessary professional consulting capabilities, licenses, certifications, experience, resources and facilities to provide to EL DORADO

TRANSIT the services contemplated under this Agreement. CONSULTANT further agrees that he/she will follow the current, prevailing, generally accepted practice of the consulting profession to make findings, render opinions, prepare factual presentations, and provide professional advice and recommendations regarding the project for which services are rendered under this Agreement.

SECTION 11 - RESPONSIBILITY OF EL DORADO TRANSIT

In relation to the project/work described by this Agreement, EL DORADO TRANSIT shall:

- A. Assist CONSULTANT by placing at his/her disposal all available information pertinent to the project, including previous reports and any other relevant data;
- B. Guarantee access to and make all provisions for CONSULTANT to enter upon public and private property as required for CONSULTANT to perform his/her services;
- C. Examine all studies, reports, proposals and other documents presented by CONSULTANT, and render verbally or in writing as may be appropriate, decisions pertaining thereto within a reasonable time so as not to delay the services of CONSULTANT;
- D. Designate in writing a person to act as EL DORADO TRANSIT'S representative with respect to all work to be performed under this Agreement. Such person shall have complete authority to transmit instructions, receive information, interpret and define EL DORADO TRANSIT'S policies and decisions with respect to materials, equipment, elements and systems pertinent to CONSULTANT'S services; and
- E. Furnish approvals and permits from all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the project and such approvals and consents from others as may be necessary for completion of the Project.

SECTION 12 - TERM

The term of this Agreement shall commence upon EL DORADO TRANSIT'S issuance to CONSULTANT of a Purchase Order for all or a portion of the work as hereinabove provided, and shall end upon EL DORADO TRANSIT'S acceptance and payment for such portion of the work as was authorized by such notice, but in no event beyond the end of the Fiscal Year 2018/19.

SECTION 13 - TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE OF EL DORADO TRANSIT

EL DORADO TRANSIT may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving notice to CONSULTANT of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, at least ten (10) days before the effective date of such termination. In such event, all finished or unfinished documents and other materials shall, at the option of EL DORADO TRANSIT, become its property. If this Agreement is terminated by EL DORADO TRANSIT as provided herein, CONSULTANT shall be paid a total amount that is the ratio of completed tasks, and mutually agreed percent-completed tasks, to total services as determined by EL DORADO TRANSIT, less payments already made under this contract. This proration shall be extended to cover any fixed fee charged for a fully completed product.

SECTION 14 - TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT FOR CAUSE

- A. EL DORADO TRANSIT may, by written notice to CONSULTANT, terminate the whole or any part of this Agreement in any one of the following circumstances:
- If CONSULTANT fails to perform the services called for by this Agreement within the time(s) specified herein, or any extension thereof; or
- 2. If CONSULTANT fails to perform the services called for by this Agreement or so fails to make progress as to endanger performance of this Agreement in accordance with its terms, and in either of these two circumstances does not substantially begin to correct such failure within a period of ten (10) days (or such longer period as EL DORADO TRANSIT may authorize in writing) after receipt of notice from EL DORADO TRANSIT specifying such failure.
- B. In the event EL DORADO TRANSIT terminates this Agreement in whole or in part as provided in Paragraph "A" above, EL DORADO TRANSIT may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it may determine appropriate, services similar to those terminated.
- C. Except with respect to defaults of subcontractors, CONSULTANT shall not be liable for any excess costs if the failure to perform arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of CONSULTANT. Such causes include, but are not limited to, acts of God or of the public enemy, acts of government, in its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, and unusually severe weather. In the event the failure to perform is caused by the default of a subcontractor, CONSULTANT shall not be liable for failure to perform, unless the services to be furnished by the subcontractor were obtainable from other sources in sufficient time and within budgeted resources to permit CONSULTANT to meet the required delivery schedule or other performance requirements.
- D. Should the Agreement be terminated as provided in Paragraph "A" above, CONSULTANT shall provide EL DORADO TRANSIT with all finished and unfinished documents, data, studies, services, drawings, maps, models, photographs, reports, etc., prepared by CONSULTANT pursuant to this Agreement. Upon termination as provided in Paragraph "A" above, CONSULTANT shall be paid the value of the work performed, as determined by EL DORADO TRANSIT, less payments of compensation previously made. Payments previously made by EL DORADO TRANSIT to CONSULTANT shall be credited to the amount payable to CONSULTANT for allowable costs as provided herein, except, however, CONSULTANT shall be entitled to a proportionate fixed fee, if any, which in the opinion of EL DORADO TRANSIT, it has legitimately earned and was not related to the cause for which this Agreement was terminated.
- E. If after notice of termination of this Agreement, as provided for in this Section, it is determined for any reason that CONSULTANT was not in default under the provisions of this Section or that the default was excusable under the provisions of this Section, then the rights and obligations of the parties shall be the same as if the Agreement had been terminated for the convenience of EL DORADO TRANSIT.

SECTION 15 - INTEREST OF OFFICIALS AND CONSULTANT

- A. No member of, or delegate to, the Congress of the United States of America nor any Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part hereof or to any benefits to arise here from.
- B. CONSULTANT hereby covenants that he or she has, at the time of the execution of this Agreement, no interest, and that he or she shall not acquire any interest in the future, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services required to be performed pursuant to this Agreement. CONSULTANT further covenants that in the performance of this work, no person having any such interest shall be employed.

SECTION 16 - SUBCONTRACTING

- A. CONSULTANT shall not subcontract or otherwise assign any portion of the work to be performed under this Agreement without the prior written approval of EL DORADO TRANSIT.
- B. In no event shall CONSULTANT subcontract for work in excess of the amounts shown in Exhibit "A". Specialized services are those items not ordinarily furnished by a consultant performing the particular type of study.
- C. All subcontracts shall be subject to the provisions contained in this contract between EL DORADO TRANSIT and CONSULTANT.

SECTION 17 - SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of any successors to, or assigns of, the parties. CONSULTANT shall not assign, delegate or transfer the rights and duties under this Agreement or any part thereof without the prior written consent of the other party to this Agreement.

SECTION 18 - INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

EL DORADO TRANSIT and CONSULTANT agree that CONSULTANT is an independent contractor. CONSULTANT shall be solely responsible for the conduct and control of the work performed under this Agreement. CONSULTANT shall be free to render consulting services to others during the term of this Agreement, so long as such activities do not interfere with or diminish CONSULTANT'S ability to fulfill the obligations established herein to EL DORADO TRANSIT.

SECTION 19 - EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

In connection with the performance of this Agreement, CONSULTANT shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, age, creed, sex, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship.

SECTION 20 - DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE)

- A. To the extent that Federal funds are used, it is the policy of the U.S. Department of Transportation that minority and women-owned business enterprises (hereby referred to as DBEs), as defined in 49 CFR Part 23 shall have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of contracts financed in whole or in part with Federal funds under this Agreement.
- B. To the extent applicable, CONSULTANT agrees to ensure that DBEs have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of contracts and subcontracts financed in whole or in part with Federal funds provided under this Agreement. In this regard, CONSULTANT shall take all necessary and reasonable steps in accordance with 49 CFR Part 23 to ensure that DBEs have the maximum opportunity to compete for and perform contracts. CONSULTANT shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the award and performance of DOT-assisted contracts.
- C. All subcontracts awarded by CONSULTANT shall contain the provisions included in paragraphs (A) and (B), as described immediately above.

SECTION 21 - TITLE VI COMPLIANCE

- A. CONSULTANT agrees to comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (49 USC 2000d) and the regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation issued thereunder in 49 CFR Part 21.
- B. During the performance of this Agreement the CONSULTANT, for itself, its assignees and successors in interest, agrees as follows:
- 1. Compliance with Regulations: The CONSULTANT shall comply with the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination in federally-assisted programs, Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 21, as they may be amended during the period of this contract (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations), which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this Agreement.
- 2. Nondiscrimination: The CONSULTANT, with regard to the work performed by it during the Agreement, shall not discriminate on the grounds of race, religion, color, sex, age or national origin in the selection or retention of subcontractors, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment. The CONSULTANT shall not participate either directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by Section 21.5 of the Regulations, including employment practices when the Agreement covers a program set forth in Appendix B of the Regulations.
- 3. Solicitations for subcontractors, including Procurements of Materials and Equipment: In all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiations made by the CONSULTANT for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of equipment, each potential subcontractor or supplier shall be notified by the CONSULTANT of the CONSULTANT'S obligations under this Agreement and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, religion, color, sex, age or national origin.

- 4. Information and Reports: The CONSULTANT shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information and its facilities as may be determined by EL DORADO TRANSIT to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations, orders and instructions. Where any information required of a consultant is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, the CONSULTANT shall so certify to EL DORADO TRANSIT, as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.
- C. Sanctions for Noncompliance: In the event of the CONSULTANT'S noncompliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of this Agreement, EL DORADO TRANSIT shall impose such contract sanctions as it may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
- 1. Withholding of payments to the CONSULTANT under the Agreement until the CONSULTANT complies, and/or;
- 2. Cancellation, termination or suspension of the Agreement, in whole or in part.
- D. Incorporation of Provisions: the CONSULTANT shall include the provisions of Paragraphs A and B (including all subparts) of this Section in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Regulations, or directives issued pursuant thereto. The CONSULTANT shall take such action with respect to any subcontract or procurement as EL DORADO TRANSIT may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance: provided, however, that in the event a contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or supplier as a result of such direction, the CONSULTANT may request EL DORADO TRANSIT to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of EL DORADO TRANSIT, and in addition, the CONSULTANT may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.
- E. Civil Rights: All subcontractors awarded by contractors shall contain provisions requiring compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended. Accordingly, 49 CFR Part 21, through Appendix C and 23 CFR 710.405(b) shall be made applicable by reference in all subcontracts financed in whole or in part with Federal funds.

SECTION 22 - PUBLICATION

- A. Any and all reports published by CONSULTANT shall acknowledge that it was prepared in cooperation with EL DORADO TRANSIT.
- B. Articles, reports, or works reporting on the work provided for herein, or on portions thereof, which are published by CONSULTANT shall contain in the foreword, preface, or footnote the following statement:

"The contents of this report reflect the view of the author who is responsible for the facts and accuracy of the data presented herein. The contents do not necessarily reflect the official views of EL DORADO TRANSIT. This report does not constitute a standard, specification, or regulation."

C. Articles, reports, or works reporting on the work provided for herein, or on portions thereof, which are published by CONSULTANT shall contain in the inside cover page:

SECTION 23 - INDEMNIFICATION

To the fullest extent allowed by law, CONSULTANT shall defend, indemnify, and hold the EL DORADO TRANSIT, its officers, agents and employees, harmless against and from any all claims, suits, losses, damages and liability for damages, including reasonable attorney's fees and costs incurred, brought for, or on account of, injuries to or death of any person, including but not limited to workers, EL DORADO TRANSIT employees, and the public, or damage to property, or any economic or consequential losses, to the extent caused by the negligent acts, errors or omissions, recklessness, or willful misconduct, of CONSULTANT or those for whom CONSULTANT is legally liable and which are claimed to or in any way arise out of or are connected with the Work by CONSULTANT, his agents or employees including CONSULTANT's services, operations, or performance hereunder, regardless of the existence or degree of fault or negligence on the part of EL DORADO TRANSIT, CONSULTANT, subcontractor(s) and employee(s) of CONSULTANT, or any of these, except for the sole, or active negligence of EL DORADO TRANSIT, its officers and employees, and except as expressly prescribed by statute. This duty of CONSULTANT to indemnify and hold EL DORADO TRANSIT harmless includes the duties to defend set forth in California Civil Code Section 2778.

SECTION 24 – INSURANCE

The CONSULTANT shall provide proof of a policy of insurance satisfactory to EL DORADO TRANSIT and documentation evidencing that the CONSULTANT maintains insurance that meets the following requirements.

- A. Full Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance covering all employees of CONSULTANT as required by law in the State of California. If CONSULTANT does not have any employees, CONSULTANT is not required to maintain Worker's Compensation Insurance.
- B. Commercial General Liability Insurance of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage
- C. Automobile Liability Insurance of not less than Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000) is required in the event motor vehicles are used by the CONSULTANT in performance of the Agreement.
- D. Proof of coverage satisfactory to EL DORADO TRANSIT as evidence that the insurance required herein is being maintained shall be provided. The insurance will be issued by an insurance company acceptable to EL DORADO TRANSIT, or be provided through partial or total self-insurance likewise acceptable to EL DORADO TRANSIT.
- E. The certificate of insurance must include the following provisions stating that:

- 1) The insurance required herein shall provide that no cancellation or material change in any policy shall become effective except upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to EL DORADO TRANSIT; and
- 2) EL DORADO TRANSIT, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are included as additional insured, but only insofar as the operations under this Agreement are concerned. This provision shall apply to all liability policies except Workers' Compensation, automobile and professional liability insurance policies. Proof that EL DORADO TRANSIT is named additional insured shall be made by providing EL DORADO TRANSIT with a certified copy, or other acceptable evidence, or an endorsement to insurance policy naming EL DORADO TRANSIT as additional insured.
- F. CONSULTANT agrees that the insurance required herein shall be in effect at all times during the term of this Agreement. In the event said insurance coverage expires at any time or times during the term of this Agreement, CONSULTANT agrees to provide at least thirty (30) days prior to said expiration date, a new certificate of insurance evidencing insurance coverage as provided for herein for not less than the remainder of the term of the Agreement, or for a period of not less than one (1) year. New certificates of insurance are subject to the approval of EL DORADO TRANSIT and CONSULTANT agrees that no work or services shall be performed prior to such approval. In the event CONSULTANT fails to keep in effect at all times insurance coverage as herein provided, EL DORADO TRANSIT may, in addition to any other remedies it may have, terminate this Agreement upon the occurrence of such event.
- G. Certificate of insurance shall meet such additional standards as may be determined by EL DORADO TRANSIT as essential for protection of EL DORADO TRANSIT.
- H. CONSULTANT shall not commence performance of this Agreement unless and until compliance with each and every requirement of the insurance policy is achieved.
- I. Failure of CONSULTANT to maintain the insurance required herein, or to comply with any of the requirements of the insurance provisions, shall constitute a material breach of the entire Agreement.
- J. Any failure to comply with the reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the District, its officers, officials, employees or volunteers.
- K. The CONSULTANT's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects EL DORADO TRANSIT, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by EL DORADO TRANSIT, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be in excess of the CONSULTANT's insurance and shall not contribute with it.

- L. The insurance companies shall have no recourse against EL DORADO TRANSIT, its officers, agents, employees or any of them for payment of any premiums or assessments under any policy issued by an insurance company.
- M. CONSULTANT's indemnity and other obligations shall not be limited by the insurance required herein and shall survive the expiration of this Agreement.
- N. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared and approved by EL DORADO TRANSIT. At EL DORADO TRANSIT's option, either: Insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects EL DORADO TRANSIT, its officers, employees and volunteers, or CONSULTANT shall procure a bond guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claim administration, and defense expenses.
- O. In the event CONSULTANT cannot provide an occurrence policy, CONSULTANT shall provide insurance covering claims made as a result of performance of this Agreement for not less than three (3) years following completion of performance of this Agreement.

SECTION 25 - OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

Original documents, methodological explanations, computer programs, computer files, drawings, designs and reports generated by this Agreement shall belong to and become the property of EL DORADO TRANSIT in accordance with accepted standards relating to public work contracts. Any additional copies, not otherwise provided for herein, shall be the responsibility of EL DORADO TRANSIT. Software used but not created in the performance of this agreement is <u>not</u> included. CONSULTANT shall not be held responsible for modification, re-use, or misuse of these various documents and other instruments of professional service.

SECTION 26 - DOCUMENTATION/ACCESS TO RECORDS

CONSULTANT shall document the results of the work to the satisfaction of EL DORADO TRANSIT. Such documentation may include preparation of progress and final reports, plans, specifications and estimates, or similar evidence of attainment of contract objectives.

CONSULTANT and its subcontractors shall maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting records, and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred, and makes such materials available at their respective offices at all reasonable times during the contract period and for three years from the date of final payment to CONSULTANT. Such materials shall be available for inspection by authorized representatives of EL DORADO TRANSIT, or the copies thereof shall be furnished if requested. The U.S. Department of Transportation, Caltrans, the Comptroller General of the United States, or any authorized representatives of these agencies, shall have access to any books, documents, papers and records of the CONSULTANT which are directly pertinent to that specific contract, for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts, and/or transcriptions.

SECTION 27 - NOTICES

Any notices required to be given pursuant to this Agreement shall be deemed to have been given by their deposit, postage prepaid, in the United States Postal Service, addressed to the parties as follows:

Nothing hereinabove shall prevent either EL DORADO TRANSIT or CONSULTANT from personally delivering any such notices to the other.

SECTION 28 - JURISDICTION

Except as otherwise specifically provided, this Agreement shall be administered and interpreted under the laws of the State of California. Jurisdiction of litigation arising from this Agreement shall be in that State. If any part of this Agreement is found to be in conflict with applicable laws, such part shall be inoperative, null and void insofar as it is in conflict with said laws, but the remainder of the Agreement shall be in full force and effect.

SECTION 29 - INTEGRATION

This agreement represents the entire understanding of EL DORADO TRANSIT and CONSULTANT as to those matters contained herein. No prior oral or written understanding shall be of any force or effect with respect to those matters covered hereunder. This Agreement may not be modified or altered except in writing signed by EL DORADO TRANSIT and CONSULTANT.

SECTION 30 – CONFIDENTIALITY

CONSULTANT hereto agrees to keep confidential and not to disclose, directly or indirectly, any information regarding the EL DORADO TRANSIT's business, including without limitation, information with respect to operations, procedures, methods, accounting, technical data, or existing or potential customers, or any other information which EL DORADO TRANSIT has designated as confidential.

CONSULTANT agrees that CONSULTANT, its employees, agents and representatives shall not, either during the term of this Agreement or at any time thereafter, disclose any

proprietary, secret or confidential information of EL DORADO TRANSIT to any third party whatsoever without express written consent of EL DORADO TRANSIT.

CONSULTANT shall secure all documents, work in process, products or other items incorporating any EL DORADO TRANSIT's information in a manner that will prevent its unauthorized disclosure.

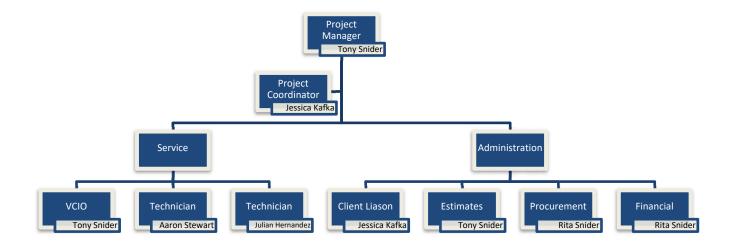

Since I am a novice web manager, if I had problems editing my website, do you offer assistance with my web editing program?

Gold or Platinum would cover any and all desktop issues as needed. Silver would have scheduled visits (could be remote also) under a block of time allocated for reactive support, we could handle that. Monitoring plan doesn't include reactive support labor on the desktops, so that would be a billable ticket.

We usually have contractors on our projects or premises that have an insurance rider for liability in case they are hurt. I believe this is a free service from your insurance company. Would you be able to offer that to us, assuming we would have you on our premises for work?

Yes, we definitely have a liability insurance policy. We will provide that for you as needed

Appendix B - General Provisions

Services Definition

To ensure RTS' ability to provide satisfaction to Client, the following provisions apply as appropriate to ITCaresM services contracted with RTS.

Important Information

Site Survey: At the initiation of services, **if applicable**, RTS will dispatch one or more engineers or technicians to document the current configuration of the network, current support contracts with technology related vendors including contact and support information. This process allows the RTS Support Team to understand Client's environment and to quickly diagnose problems. Clients with newly installed networks are not applicable.

Vendor Liaison: RTS will act as Client's duly appointed representative and advocate. RTS Support Team will diagnose problems and dispatch or contact third parties such as Internet providers, Hardware manufacturers, etc... when deemed necessary. **RTS Support Team is not intended to replace third party application support.**

Best Interest: In the event of a failure or problem, remedial activities (up to the contracted specified level) may commence prior to notifying Client of the problem. This will allow the RTS Support Team the ability to begin problem resolution, open trouble tickets with other vendors, or dispatch engineers and technicians with replacement parts when deemed necessary. In doing so, RTS is acting in Client's best interest to resolve the issue as quickly as possible.

Every Effort: Client's end users will make every effort to resolve problems with the RTS Support Team via remote access, telephone, or email, prior to RTS dispatching on-site support.

Administrative Access: It is preferable and in the case of ITCaresM, mandatory that RTS maintain and control administrative access to Client's network and be responsible for providing all other third parties with needed or requested access.

ITCare Managed Backup Service

RTS will setup, configure, and manage local backup repositories for all designated Managed Servers. All endpoints will be backed up to an onsite NAS (network-attached-storage). RTS will manage and maintain NAS device, and repair or replace proactively or reactively as needed, whichever comes first.

RTS will receive alerting on backup failures and dispatch priority troubleshooting in event of backup failure to repair as quickly as possible.

RTS will manage transmission of cloud backups from onsite repository (NAS) to Cloud Repository (currently with client-owned Global Data Vault) and ensure successful backups.

Client will be alerted to backup failures and any required maintenance or changes in event of maintenance, upgrade, or repairs needed.

Exceptions

- Additional VMs will require additional cost, configuration, and setup and will not be backed up without approval.
- Workstation local endpoint backups are not managed or monitored as part of this agreement, but have been installed as a courtesy. Users are responsible for alerting when endpoint backups do not work and require troubleshooting.

- 1. Approve the engagement of a five (5) year Lease Purchase option to partially fund the purchase of five (5) MCI Commuter Coaches
- 2. Approve Revised Capital Improvement Project 17-02 (2) to reflect revised funding strategy
- 3. Authorize the Executive Director, with Legal Counsel review, to execute all documents relating to the project up to the approved budget as presented in project 17-02 (2)

BACKGROUND

On June 6, 2016 the El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) Board adopted the <u>Capital Improvement Plan for Fiscal Year 2016/17</u> (CIP). Included in the CIP is project 17-02 Vehicle Replacement 5 Year Plan – Commuter, which is to replace five (5) 40' Bluebird buses.

The buses to be replaced are 2006 models and no longer supported by the manufacturer. Parts are difficult to source driving repair costs higher than expected. The intent is to replace these buses with the Motor Coach Industries (MCI) commuter coach.

El Dorado Transit is participating in a joint-procurement contract with the City of Fairfield and the Yolo County Transportation District. This agreement was approved by El Dorado Transit Board on November 7, 2017.

June 2018 is the expected delivery date for the five (5) commuter coaches.

DISCUSSION

Originally this replacement was planned as a five-year plan using a combination of Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5307, 5339 and State Transit Assistance (STA) funds.

El Dorado County Transit Authority April 5, 2018 Agenda Using this timing strategy, El Dorado Transit would "bank" FTA Section 5307 annual allocations and purchase either two (2) or three (3) units in the first order with the final order of three (3) or two (2) depending on timing of the allocations; for a total of five (5) units.

It has come to our attention that the manufacturers' understanding is that all five (5) buses are to be ordered at once. This planning/purchase change presents a negative cash flow issue. El Dorado Transit currently has the first two (2) allocations of Section 5307 for a total of \$693,430; Section 5339 of \$800,000 and STA allocated to the project in the amount of \$600,000. This creates a shortfall of approximately \$906,570 based on current cost estimates.

Funding capital projects using STA is a standard procedure for El Dorado Transit. If STA funds are not needed to supplement operating costs and the current years capital expenses; deferred funds are held.

Federal grant awards are on a reimbursable basis. Generally Federal grants require a formula of eighty (80) percent Federal and twenty (20) percent local matching funds. El Dorado Transit must have the funds available to fully pay for assets, then submit a request for reimbursement. This process can take months to receive reimbursement.

The Preliminary Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Fiscal Year 2018/19 approved by the Board on March 1, 2018, reflected a preliminary budget amount of \$977,776 of STA. While this is true, these funds are not reimbursable through a grant and has taken years to build.

On February 12, 2018 El Dorado Transit was awarded an FTA Section 5310 grant for the replacement of five (5) minivans and five (5) cutaway buses; CIP project 19-04 is presented in this agenda as a separate item for adoption. The proposed budget for this project is \$825,000 meaning El Dorado Transit is responsible for the full payment to the vendor; with a reimbursable amount of FTA Section 5310 funds of \$610,000.

In August 2017 El Dorado Transit applied for an FTA Section 5339 grant to fund five (5) replacement Gillig type buses for Local Route service. If successful the estimated total cost will be 2,800,000 of which \$2,380,000 will be reimbursed.

All but one (1) project in the CIP FY 2018/19 are partially funded with STA.

The original five (5) year funding plan for the five (5) MCI buses was designed to integrate with all other purchases

Due to the unforeseen circumstances management staff has suspended progress on the following non-essential CIP projects;

A comprehensive review of the capital program has been completed with the following conclusions;

- o The unanticipated delivery schedule for the MCI commuter coaches has negatively affected the procurement of all CIP projects from a cash flow perspective.
- O Three cycles of FTA Section 5307 grant funds originally scheduled for MCI commuter coaches will be reallocated to either Preventative Maintenance (PM) or other eligible capital projects as they are realized; no loss of future grant funding from 5307 (approx. \$1,000,000).
- o Federal grants require proof of payment when a Request for Reimbursement is filed; these grants are on a reimbursable basis.
- o El Dorado Transit will not have the capital cash flow needed to successfully pre-pay for the three (3) vehicle procurement projects currently in the CIP under the revised delivery schedule of the five (5) MCI commuter coaches.

El Dorado Transit staff is looking at options to fund MCI commuter bus purchase.

Option #1 - Use STA Deferred Revenue to fund the shortfall.

• El Dorado Transit has available approximately \$977,000. If this option is chosen, while possible, would adversely affect capital cash flow and could affect the implementation schedule of other active capital projects.

Option #2 - Lease Purchase El Dorado County Transit Authority April 5, 2018 Agenda • El Dorado Transit has requested leasing option quotes. Quotes are to include lease amount of \$1,200,000 to provide funding for the entire amount of STA funds of the project.

Staff has contacted several financial institutions for information on a potential Lease Purchase to fund the MCI vehicle procurement.

Under this scenario El Dorado Transit would enter into a lease purchase in the amount of \$1,200,000. The remaining funds of \$1,800,000 of STA will be used to pay for the purchase. Upon vehicle receipt a Request for Reimbursement will be filed for reimbursement of Section 5307 funds in the amount of \$693,430 and Section 5339 in the amount of \$800,000. Therefore all but \$306,570 of STA funds will be recouped and available for payment of CIP 18-04 and 19-04.

BACKGROUND

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) was formed on January 1, 1994 as a Joint Powers Authority (JPA) between the County of El Dorado and the City of Placerville.

On August 8, 1994, El Dorado Transit's contracted with the California Public Retirement System (CalPERS) for employee Pensions. El Dorado Transit opted to pay the estimated unfunded liability for future costs on a per pay period basis. As of FY 2015/16 the Unfunded Liability is a separate payment which can be made on a monthly or annual basis. El Dorado Transit pays one (1) annual lump sum payment to avoid monthly interest payments.

On July 1, 2007 El Dorado Transit contracted with CalPERS to provide Other-Post Retirement Benefits (OPEB) of medical benefits for unrepresented employees. This action required participation in the California Employers' Retirement Benefit Trust (CERBT) Fund to prefund future unfunded OPEB liabilities.

Changes to both contracts with regard to yearly cost estimations have occurred over time however; each annual operating budget has included current and future estimated funding of pension and OPEB due during each fiscal year.

Recently the Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) has made several pronouncements specifically designed to inform the public of future liability costs associated with public employee Pension and OPEB benefit costs.

DISCUSSION

At the December 1, 2017 regularly scheduled Board of Directors meeting, the Mid-Year Budget was adopted for Fiscal Year (FY) 2017/18. The Board requested staff analyze the feasibility of projecting the Unfunded Liability out five (5) years for both the Pension and OPEB.

Software packages are available to produce these estimates in-house. Staff reviewed several products and GovInvest was determined to be the most realistic product for our agency size and demographics. Below is an overview of our current methodology vs. GovInvest.

Staff requested our outside Certified Public Accounting (CPA) consultant to review and comment on the GovInvest proposal. Below is an excerpt from the response;

"This is to document the issues I discussed with you regarding the GovInvest service.

- 1. I have trouble to establish the need for the service beyond year-end payable accrual.
- 2. This service would result in more work from the accounting department to upload your

- data to the service.
- 3. The costs for the service would only replace the Bickmore OPEB accrual, so this service adds substantially to your annual costs and provides very little value.
- 4. I realize that the proposal would provide limited services of an actuary but the real issue is that EDCTA does not have the Finance/Economist/Actuary on staff to make any meaningful use of the service.
- 5. In my estimation, I see that EDCTA would need to inquire of CalPERS to gather the variables needed to put together any reasonable estimate of liabilities. If you have to get the assumptions from CalPERS, I suggest that you continue to use the CalPERS service.

In my opinion, I see the service to be a lot of extra work to set up and maintain, EDCTA lacks the staffing to provide the inputs needed and there is no value for the service to provide accruals more often than year-end that would justify the additional cost over your existing service. I would not proceed any further."

Fiscal year 2016/17 audited financial statements reports a Net Pension Liability of \$2,614,209. This represents the amount due to CalPERS if El Dorado Transit discontinued operations as of June 30, 2017.

El Dorado County Transit Authority April 5, 2018 Agenda Staff is confident that the current financial position as it relates to Pension and OPEB Liabilities is sustainable. Yearly expenses to continue to prefund will help stabilize that part of the calculation under control of El Dorado Transit.

Staff does not recommend the additional \$8,000 and additional staff time required to utilize GovInvest.

Local Route Changes

On Monday April 16, 2018 the following route changes on the local fixed routes will be implemented:

Route 30- Diamond Springs/El Dorado -

There will be an additional request stop at the El Dorado Transit Offices after the Missouri Flat Storage Depot stop. The current request stop for the El Dorado Transit Offices after Independence High School will still be available. This change will give passengers a way to go to the El Dorado Transit office to purchase passes without waiting an hour for the next bus. Other changes to the route include changing the Independence High School stop to a request stop and time adjustments to some other stops to more accurately reflect actual travel times.

Route 35 - Diamond Springs/El Dorado Saturday — Time adjustments are being implemented to mirror the time adjustments to Route 30.

Route 40 - Cameron Park/Shingle Springs -

The bus will service stops on Coach Lane and on Palmer Drive in both directions. As a result, time adjustments are being implemented at many of the stops on the route. These changes will give passengers better access to the bus stops at the major shopping areas in Cameron Park. The transfer point with the 50 Express will remain at the Ponderosa Road Park-and-Ride.

Route 50X - 50 Express — The stop at Intel will be moved from :58 to :55 each hour to more accurately reflect actual travel times.

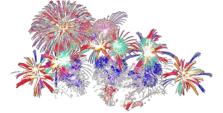
