BACKGROUND

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) staff typically reports monthly and fiscal year-to-date ridership trend reports at each Board meeting.

DISCUSSION

Following are the May, June and July 2020 monthly ridership tables comparing the current fiscal year to the previous fiscal year. Due to the COVID-19 virus and physical distancing regulations, Senior Day Care services closed on March 13, 2020 and the Mother Lode Rehabilitation Enterprises (M.O.R.E.) closed on March 16, 2020. Commuter services were decreased to four (4) buses in the morning and afternoon on March 23, 2020. Transit ridership has reduced in all areas of service.

May Ridership

Comparing May 2020 to 2019, Demand Response ridership decreased by 86.7%, Local Fixed Route ridership decreased by 49.5% and Commuter ridership decreased by 92.8%. Productivity decreased by 50.7% in passengers per revenue hour.

Comparing June 2020 to 2019, Demand Response ridership decreased by 76.5%, Local Fixed Route ridership decreased by 12.5% and Commuter ridership decreased by 90.6%. Productivity decreased by 39.1% in passengers per revenue hour.

Comparing July 2020 to 2019, Demand Response ridership decreased by 80.3%, Local Fixed Route ridership decreased by 20.3% and Commuter ridership decreased by 89.9%. Productivity decreased by 36.8% in passengers per revenue hour.

Following are the May, June and July 2020 and fiscal year-to-date ridership reports, comparing the current fiscal year to the previous fiscal year.

On April 6, 2020 El Dorado Transit suspended collection of fares in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. As a result, El Dorado Transit recorded no taps in May, June and July 2020. Fares were reinstated on August 1, 2020 resulting in sales of monthly passes and cash purse loading in July. Following is the Connect Card Ridership Report for the past twelve (12) months with a graph showing the percent of total Connect Card ridership per month and a graph showing the fare revenues per month.

Ridership has gradually increased since the lowest month in April 2020 which had 8,317 passenger boardings. Most of the growth is attributed to increases in Local Fixed Route boardings.

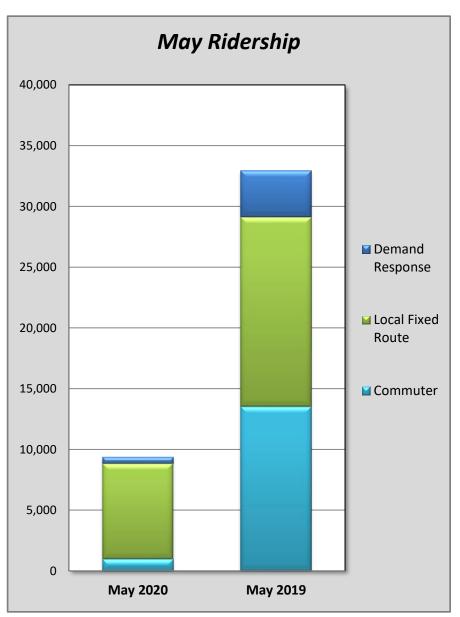

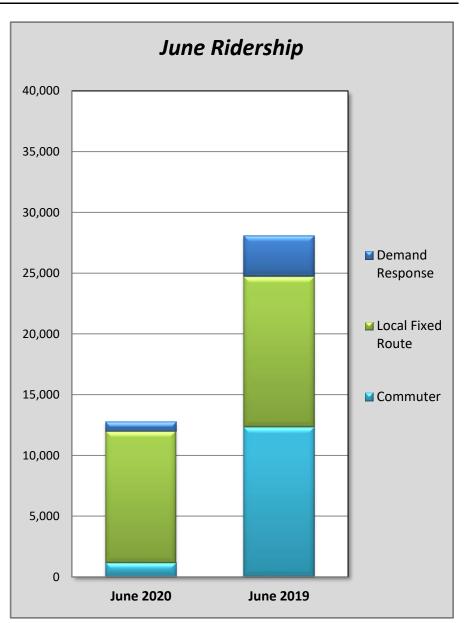

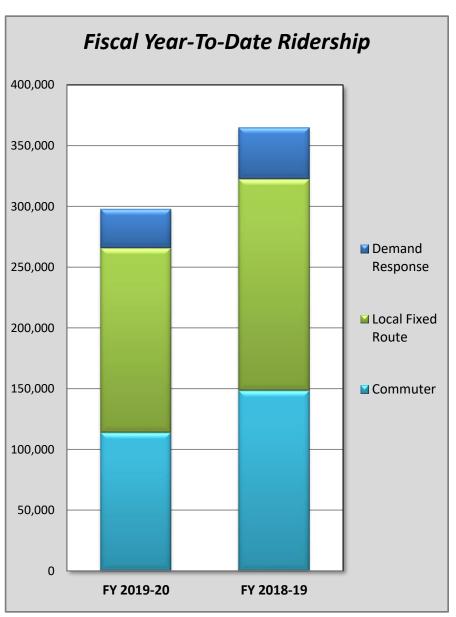

Adopt Resolution No. 20-24 defining agency contributions for health premium benefits for unrepresented regular and management employees for Calendar Year 2021

BACKGROUND

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) agency's portion of health care insurance premium contribution is established annually by resolution. El Dorado Transit contracts with the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) to provide health care benefits for unrepresented regular and management employees.

DISCUSSION

Resolution No. 20-24 defines agency contributions towards health premium benefits for unrepresented regular and management employees for Calendar Year 2021. Rates reflect medical, dental and vision coverages. Dental and vision rates will not increase for the 2021 plan year. Health rates on average increased 4.44 percent across the CalPERS Basic Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) plans and rates for the Basic Preferred Provider Organization (PPO) plans will see an overall average increase of 8.54 percent. There are no copay or coinsurance changes for 2021. There are also no changes to the plans offered within El Dorado County.

Open enrollment period begins September 21, 2020 and ends on October 16, 2020.

FISCAL IMPACT

The adopted Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2020/21 includes the Health Insurance line item projected at a total of \$1,052,200 for unrepresented and represented employees. The portion of that amount budgeted for the unrepresented and management employee group is projected at \$563,458.

WHEREAS, the El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) has unrepresented regular employees and management employees; and

WHEREAS, the El Dorado County Transit Authority Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual Article 6.2 – Employee Benefits/Insurance Plans allows El Dorado Transit to adjust contributions based upon budgetary constraints and fluctuating health care costs; and

BACKGROUND

The El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) operates with funding from the Transportation Development Act (TDA) which includes the Local Transportation Fund (LTF) and State Transit Assistance (STA), Federal Transit Administration (FTA) funds, passenger fares and grant monies.

The TDA statute establishes the Local Transportation Fund (LTF) by designating that ¼ cent of the State sales tax revenue collected within each region be used for transportation purposes, primarily for public transit. TDA statute establishes STA from a statewide excise tax on gasoline and diesel fuel.

DISCUSSION

On March 5, 2020 El Dorado Transit approved a \$7,014,181.66 claim for Fiscal Year (FY) 2020/21 TDA funds including \$5,430,342.66 in LTF funds and \$1,583,839.00 in STA funds.

With the COVID-19 pandemic having a direct effect on sales taxes collected, it is necessary to revise the current claim to agree with amended estimates from State and Local entities.

The revised LTF claim amount is based on the August 4, 2020 Memorandum from the El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) listing the preliminary apportionment available for Public Transportation – Transit – Article 4 as \$4,257,454.16 (see attachment).

The STA claim amount is based on the revised August 1, 2020 State Controller's Office STA Fund Allocation Estimate Fiscal Year 2020/21 Summary.

The Final Operating Budget for FY 2020/21 was adopted by the Board on July 9, 2020. That budget reflected staff estimates of available TDA funds at a lower level than those of the revised estimate on the proposed claim. The increased amounts will be adjusted on or before the Mid-Year Budget Adjustment process.

The complete TDA claim packet is available for review during regular business hours at the El Dorado Transit office – 6565 Commerce Way, Diamond Springs, CA.

BACKGROUND

On August 4, 2011, the El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) adopted Resolution 11-26 establishing an Operating Reserve Policy and Resolution No. 11-27 establishing a designated target funding level of \$1,500,000 for the operating reserve account.

On April 5, 2018, the Board adopted Resolution No. 18-16 reducing the target level of funding to \$1,000,000.00 using a blended method of \$500,000 held by the El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) and the balance held by El Dorado Transit.

The intent of this fund is to create a stable funding source available to offset unexpected revenue shortfalls or increased expenses. El Dorado Transit, as a Joint Powers Agency (JPA) between the County of El Dorado and the City of Placerville does not have access to funds from jurisdictional General Funds or other municipal departments.

DISCUSSION

During the Mid-Year Budget process presented each February, revenue and expenses are analyzed to determine the financial "health" of the agency based on the first six (6) month's experience and projections are adjusted for the remainder of the year if necessary. If approved, non-operating or miscellaneous income budget line items are zeroed to make certain these funds are not needed to balance the operating budget.

Staff is recommending Board approval to designate revenue accounts; 4370.00-Bike Locker Rental, 4400.00-Advertising Income, and 4990.00-Misc. Revenue as sources of non-tax revenue to be used to fund the operating reserve.

FISCAL IMPACT

Receipts for unaudited miscellaneous revenues total \$14,696.60 for FY 2019/20. If approved this amount will be transferred into the operating reserve interest bearing account. Final transfer will occur following the Financial and Compliance Audit presented at the December Board meeting.

On July 1, 2002 the El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) moved the agency's worker compensation insurance coverage from the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) Workers Compensation Insurance Pool (A Group Insurance Pool) into the Special Districts Risk Management Authority (SDRMA) Workers Compensation Insurance Pool (Self Insurance Program). The change in coverage resulted in improved claims management and cost savings.

El Dorado Transit contracts with Sedgwick formerly York Risk Services Group, Inc. (York) to administer all workers compensation claims efficiently and effectively.

DISCUSSION

Dori Zumwalt, Senior Account Manager from Sedgwick will present the Workers Compensation Trending Report for El Dorado Transit. The report has been prepared for presentation to the Board of Directors with an update on El Dorado Transit's worker's compensation claim assessment over the previous five (5) years. This report will be utilized to identify areas that require risk analysis such as the programs strengths and weaknesses.

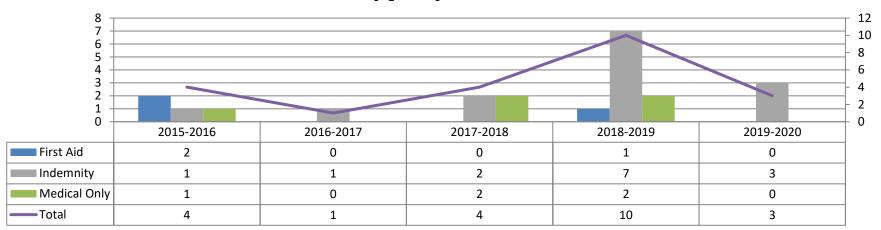

Workers' Compensation Trending Report for El Dorado County Transit Authority

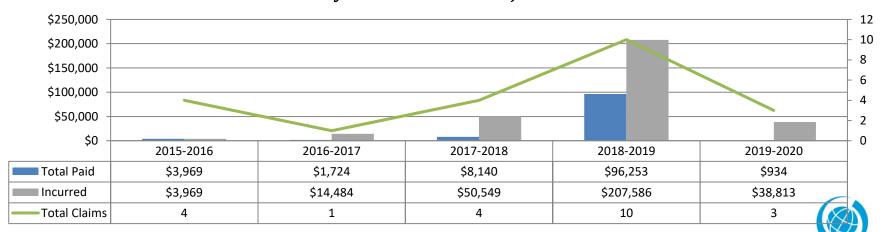

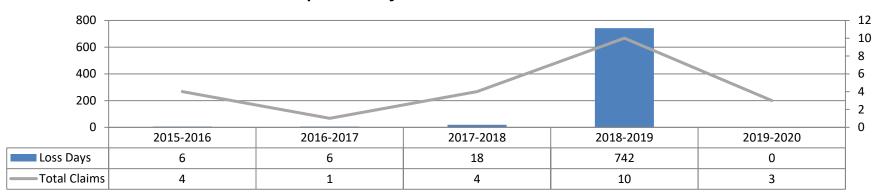
Claim Type by Fiscal Year



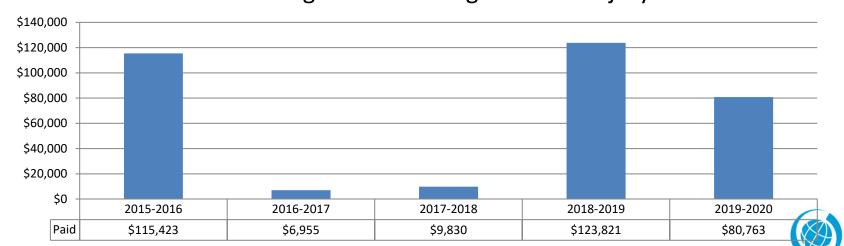
Total Paid and Incurred by Fiscal Year for Injuries within the Fiscal Year



Loss Days for Injuries within Fiscal Year



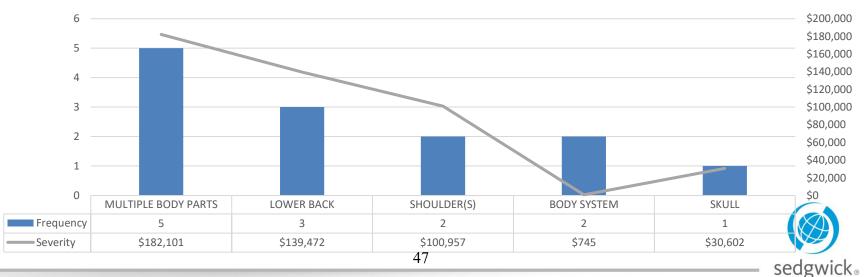
Total Paid During Fiscal Year Regardless of Injury Date



Top 5 Cause of Injury Fiscal Year 2015-2020

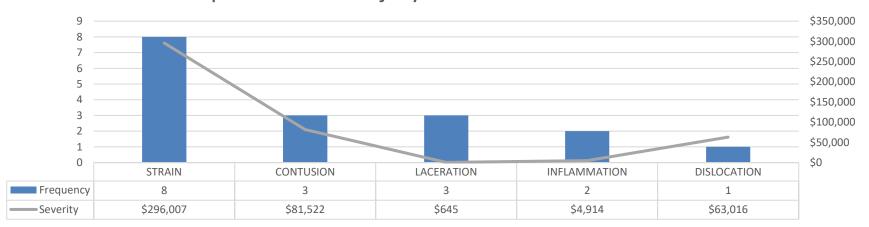


Top 5 Part of Body Injured Fiscal Year 2015-2020

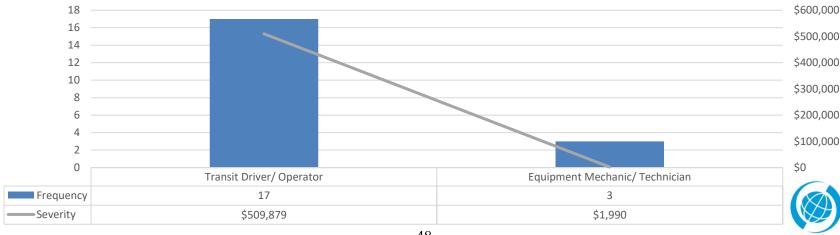


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Top 5 Nature of Injury Fiscal Year 2015-2020

Review Committee

REQUESTED ACTION:

BY MOTION,

1. Form an ad hoc Audit Review Committee to receive and review fiscal year (FY) 2019/20 independent fiscal and compliance audit reports

2. Appoint Chair and Vice-Chair as members to the Audit Review Committee

BACKGROUND

The Mills-Alquist-Deddeh Act (SB 325) was enacted by the California Legislature to improve public transportation services and encourage regional transportation coordination. Known as the Transportation Development Act (TDA) of 1971, this law provides funding to be allocated primarily for transit related purposes.

The TDA provides two (2) funding sources:

- 1. Local Transportation Fund (LTF), which is derived from a ¼ cent of the general sales tax collected statewide.
- 2. State Transit Assistance (STA), which is derived from the statewide sales tax on diesel fuel.

The California Department of Tax and Fee Administration, based on sales tax collected in each county, returns the general sales tax revenues in each county's LTF. The STA funds are appropriated by the Legislature to the State Controller's Office (SCO). The SCO then allocates the tax revenues, by formula, to planning and other selected agencies.

To ensure program compliance, independent fiscal audits are conducted annually. TDA Section 6664 requires independent fiscal and TDA compliance audits to be completed within 180 days following the end of each fiscal year. The El Dorado County Transportation Commission

(EDCTC) is responsible for ensuring that each TDA claimant under its jurisdiction receiving an allocation submits to EDCTC and the State Controller an annual certified fiscal audit report.

DISCUSSION

Richardson and Company auditors will perform the fiscal year 2019/20 on-site audit field work at the El Dorado County Transit Authority during the week of October 5, 2020. Final audit reports will be completed in late October 2020 or early November 2020.

Annually, the El Dorado County Transit Authority appoints a two (2) person sub-committee of the Board to receive the auditors' presentation of the audit prior to submission to the full Board. Staff is recommending the establishment of an ad hoc Audit Review Committee with the Chair and Vice-Chair as permanent members.

The Audit Review Committee would convene to receive an oral and written presentation of audit reports by Richardson & Company. The audit reports would then be included in the December 3, 2020 Board agenda packet as a Consent Item for consideration by the full Board.

Audit Review Committee responsibilities include:

- 1. Review of fiscal and compliance audits
- 2. One (1) meeting to receive a presentation of agency fiscal and compliance reports from the independent auditors (this meeting may be held remotely)

BY MOTION,

- 1. Receive and File the Final Proposed Amended Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2019/20
- 2. Authorize the transfer of \$943,000 in State Transit Assistance (STA) funds from the Operating Budget into the Capital program
- 3. Acknowledge the budget amount of \$1,409,540 in Deferred Local Transportation Funds (LTF)

BACKGROUND

As of August 26, 2020, most work related to posting was accomplished to close the internal fiscal year (FY) 2019/20 financials.

A Final Amended Operating Budget is typically presented to the Board of Directors following the close of the fiscal year and prior to completion of an independent financial audit. The proposed Final Amended FY 2019/20 Operating Budget (attached) reflects fiscal year-end adjustments from the adopted mid-year version, based on actual revenue and expenses realized during the period.

DISCUSSION

The proposed Final Amended FY 2019/20 Operating Budget reflects overall increases to revenue accounts and decreases to salary and benefit and general expenses. Outlined below are the recommended adjustments by line item with comments. The attached Proposed Final Amended FY 2019/20 Operating Budget sheet presents the adopted mid-year budget amounts for comparison and shows the net changes made.

The Proposed Final Amended FY 2019/20 Operating Budget includes new, unanticipated revenue from emergency CARES Act funding in the amount of \$564,119 in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5311 funds and FTA Section 5307 funds in the amount of \$950,866 for a total amount of \$1,514,985.00. Per the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement (JPA) of El Dorado County Transit Authority (El Dorado Transit) section 11.3 "*The EDCTA shall*"

actively seek to maximize utilization of Federal, State, and other available revenues which shall be applied towards such operating and capital expenditures..." Use of Federal CARES Act funds in FY 2019/20 has purposely triggered a deferred amount of LTF for use in FY 2020/21 Operating Budget.

El Dorado Transit management and staff worked well within the overall mid-year budget expense projections. The effects of COVID-19 related service reductions and temporary fare policies caused fare revenue losses of approximately \$304,000. Salary and Benefit accounts were maintained under budget by the amount of \$570,036. Service and Supply accounts were under budget by the amount of \$544,288.

Due primarily to the infusion of the emergency CARES Act funding, an increase of \$1,213,002 in Contingency Funds now totaling \$1,409,540 represents the projected amount of conventional State funding offset for use in the FY 2020/21 operating budget.

REVENUE ACCOUNTS

El Dorado Transit saw an overall decrease of approximately \$304,000 in fare revenue accounts. Including the CARES Act funds, total revenue increased by \$295,216 (3.25%).

- 1 State Transit Assistance was reduced to reflect an anticipated transfer of these revenues to the capital budget. Actual amounts will be finalized and presented in the annual independent financial audit.

SALARY & BENEFITS EXPENSE ACCOUNTS

Overall, the total Salary and Benefits expenditures were managed below mid-year budget adjustment projections by \$570,036. Although services were reduced during the last quarter of the fiscal year in response to COVID-19, staffing levels were mostly maintained and staff were compensated at regular levels through the end of the fiscal year, in keeping with the intent of the emergency CARES Act funding.

- Regular Employee salary expenses decreased to reflect actuals. Some positions were understaffed prior to the pandemic and some operational staff hours were reduced as a result of the pandemic related service reductions.
- 14 Temporary Employee costs decreased to reflect actual usage of the extra help employees.
- 15 Overtime decreased to accurately reflect costs.
- 16 On Call Pay decreased to accurately reflect usage.

- Unemployment Insurance increased to reflect actual costs. This is a reimburse only account and reflects the provision of benefits to some employees for the initial loss of hourly wages due to the pandemic related service reductions.

- Workers' Compensation reduced to reflect actual Premiums paid.

SERVICE & SUPPLY EXPENSE ACCOUNTS

Total Services and Supplies accounts decreased by \$544,288.

Final FY 2019/20 budget adjustments and financial position of the El Dorado County Transit Authority will be trued up in the independent financial audit process and presented during the December 2020 regularly scheduled Board meeting.
